### Obituaries

#### CDR Gerald F. Brummitt USN (Ret) '49

Gerald Fuller Brummitt died on November 20, 2014 of complications from Alzheimer's Disease surrounded by loving family. He was 87 at the time of his death.

Born June 3, 1927, in Henderson, North Carolina to Samuel Brooks Brummitt and Elizabeth Fuller Brummitt, Gerry was the youngest of three children. He was in the fourth generation of Brummitts to grow up on the family tobacco farm. His mother was a concert pianist and Daughter of the American Revolution.

As a young boy at the end of the Great Depression, Gerry began each day keeping the fires lit that provided smoke to cure tobacco produced on their 30-acre farm. His life would be

forever changed when a crop duster buzzed the farm one morning in his World War I biplane. The pilot saw something in Gerry and offered him the job running gas down a long dirt road to the field, where he would take adventure seekers flying for a fee. Gerry wouldn't accept his money. He wanted to fly. He went on to work odd jobs until finally earning enough money to get his private pilot license.

Always fit, always pushing the limits in sports Gerry loved to run, sail, play golf and tennis, and constantly worked to improve his physical stamina and capabilities. He applied the same determination to overcoming a debilitating childhood stutter along the way. Gerry was soon winning speech contests.

He attended high school in North Carolina and ran cross-country. He ran cross-country for the US Naval Academy too, where he graduated in 1949 with a degree in electrical engineering. While there he learned to sail, racing on the celebrated Naval Academy Luder's yawls.

After graduation, Ensign Brummitt served a tour off the coast of Korea aboard the converted minesweeper USS Doyle (DD-494/DMS-34) before realizing his ambition to become a naval aviator. He earned his wings in Corpus Christi, Texas in 1953, and was assigned to VF-61, flying F9s aboard USS Midway (CVA-41). In March of 1954, Gerry married Mary Gwendolyn Foran. They had four children – Jeffery, Elizabeth, Rosalind and David.

Gerry loved squadron life. From Oceana, Virginia, he flew A-4 aircraft in VA 81 aboard USS Shangri La (CVA-38). Then was a flight instructor in the Advanced Flying Unit in Millington, Tennessee. He served on the staff of COMFAIRELM in Naples, Italy for two years. Subsequently he was USN representative to the North American Air Defense Command at Syracuse, New York, and at Eglin Air Force Base in Fort Walton Beach, Florida. His favorite tour was Commanding Officer, VA-83 flying the Navy A-4 Skyhawk from USS Forrestal (CVA-59).

The Brummitt family came to Coronado in 1967 when Gerry was Executive Officer of USS Bon Homme Richard (CVA-31) deployed to Vietnam. He retired at the rank of Commander in 1969 after 20 years commissioned service.

As a civilian, Gerry earned his MBA from National University and founded Cybernetics of San Diego. For 20 years Cybernetics Leadership Center was active in leadership training for military and civilian clients in San Diego and Washington, D.C.

Gerry was extremely proud of his four children. He would enter tennis and golf tournaments with them, go jogging with them, and invite them to lunch at the Coronado Rotary when they were in town. He was forever calling them on the phone and checking in, getting regular updates on his extended family.

In response to a change in state funding of public schools, he founded and was an early president of the Coronado Schools Foundation and also Coronado Substance Abuse Free Environment (SAFE). He was an early participant in Coronado Main Street Ltd., he ran for city council, and he actively supported several Coronado political leaders. Over the years, he was an engaged mentor to many young adults who came to his attention. And he was a proud member of Coronado Rotary.

He was a collaborator who was brilliant at sharing a vision, recruiting people and getting things done. For many years Gerry was an active leader and participant at St. Paul's Methodist Church and in the Coronado Community Church. During his last several years he was pleased to be a member of Christ Episcopal Church.

He loved to sail his Cal-34 sailboat around the harbor and offshore as far as Catalina, which he enjoyed for 20 years sailing out of the Navy Yacht Club – Fiddler's Cove -- in Coronado.

Gerry is survived by his wife Mary Gwen Brummitt of Coronado; son Jeffrey Foran Brummitt of San Diego; daughter Elizabeth Isherwood Brummitt (Robert Mellott) of Del Mar; daughter the Reverend Rosalind Ziccardi (Chaplain, Colonel Gary Ziccardi, USAF) Okinawa, Japan; and son David Foran Brummitt of San Diego.

Five grandchildren also survive him. They are: Captain Andrew Fuller Ziccardi, Benjamin Brummitt Ziccardi, Brooks Jensen Brummitt, Sylvia Foran Brummitt and Samantha Rae Brummitt.

A Memorial Service is planned for Monday, December 29 at 11 a.m. at Christ Episcopal Church, 1119 Ninth Street, Coronado. In keeping with Gerry's community mindedness the family requests that, in lieu of flowers, contributions may be made to Coronado SAFE or Coronado Schools Foundation in the memory of Gerald F. Brummitt.

#### **VADM Edward H. Martin USN (Ret) '54**

Vice Adm. Ed Martin, who took a fall in his home on Dec. 23, died of complications from a head injury later that day in a San Diego hospital. He was 83 at the time of his death.

Edward Holmes Martin was born Sept. 30, 1931, in Savannah, Ga., the youngest of three children to DeCoursey Martin and Caroline White (Holmes) Martin. He attended Armstrong College and the University of Georgia Off-Campus Division before receiving an appointment to Annapolis in 1950. He graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1954.

He went on to flight training in Pensacola, Fla., and Kingsville, Texas, and in late 1955 was based in San Diego to serve in a number of carrier-based operations. In 1959, he became an instructor in the light jet Attack Replacement Squadron at Miramar Naval Air Station, then at Lemoore Naval Air Station. In 1964, duty sent him to the U.S. Naval War College. He would later earn a master's degree in International Affairs from The George Washington University in Washington, DC.

Admiral Martin was homeported in Jacksonville, Fla. in 1965 serving as Operations Officer and Executive Officer of Attack Squadron 34. It was while leading a flight from the carrier Intrepid (CV-11) that he was hit by enemy fire during a bombing

mission and shot down. just southeast of Hanoi. Captured July 9, 1967, he was held until March 4, 1973. In nearly six years he was confined and tortured at the infamous "Hanoi Hilton" prison.

Following his release from captivity and recovery, Admiral Martin served as Executive Assistant to the Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Air Warfare, and became the Commanding Officer of USS Saratoga (CV-60). As his military career continued to advance, he was promoted to vice admiral in 1983. Before retiring from the Navy in 1989, he served as Commander of the United States Sixth Fleet in the Mediterranean, United States Commander Eastern Atlantic, and Deputy Commander-in-Chief of U.S. Naval Forces Europe.

Vice Adm. Martin was awarded a Silver Star, two Legion of Merit medals, the Distinguished Flying Cross, and several other significant honors.

After leaving the Navy Admiral Martin and the former Sharron (Sherry) Handy resided in Coronado. They were married for 56 years. In his business career, he was director of European business development for Xerox, and founded E.H. Martin Associates and E.H. Martin Investments. He was active in several civic organizations and served on the boards of the San Diego Maritime Museum, USS Midway Museum, U.S. Naval Aviation Museum Foundation, USS Intrepid Museum, Coronado Round Table, Coronado First Bank, Mount Soledad board, the U.S. Naval Academy Alumni Association and others. He was a presidential appointee to the National Aeronautics and Space Museum Board of Advisers. And he was a member of Coronado Rotary Club.

Admiral Martin held a senior leadership position in the Naval Academy Alumni Association during a decade of change and reorganization. He was one of three elected regional Vice Chairmen, a position which was consolidated into a single national Vice Chairmanship in 1999. It was during this period that the Naval Academy Foundation was formed.

Survivors include his wife, Sherry; a daughter and son-in-law, Michelle Martin and Rick Everman of Capistrano Beach;

and a son, Peter of Miami. Another son, Beau, preceded him in death.

Services will be held at 11 a.m. Saturday, Jan. 10, at Christ Episcopal Church Coronado, 1114 9th St., Coronado. Burial arrangements are pending. In lieu of flowers, the family suggests donation to the United States Naval Academy Foundation, 25 Maryland Ave., Annapolis, Md., 21401, "In memory of Vice Admiral Edward H. Martin."

#### **COL William E. Hutchison USMC (Ret) '51**

Colonel Bill "Hutch" Hutchison died of complications following surgery in San Diego, California on December 21, 2014. He was 86 years old at the time of his death. Born in San Francisco on July 23, 1928 to William J. and Laura Hutchison, Bill grew up in Medford, Oregon and Boise, Idaho.

He graduated from Boise High School and spent a year at the University of Oregon before being appointed to the U.S. Naval Academy from Idaho. In his youth he spent his summers piling brush with Forest Service crews, manning fire lookouts and fighting fires. He graduated from the Naval Academy with the other 724 members of the Class of 1951 on 1 June 1951. He was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant in the U.S. Marine Corps. Shortly thereafter, he married the former Claire Apgar of Millburn, New Jersey.

Following training at Quantico, Virginia, he served in combat in Korea as an infantry platoon leader where he earned the Silver

Star and was wounded in action. He also served in Vietnam with the 3rd Marine Division during the Tet Offensive of 1968. He had a 25-year career in the Marine Corps, earning the Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal, Navy Commendation Medal with Combat "V" and the Purple Heart along with numerous other service awards. His duty stations included MCRD, San Diego; Quantico, Virginia; Kaneohe, Hawaii with the 4th Marine Regiment; Headquarters, Marine Corps; and The Pentagon in the JCS Strategy and Gaming Agency; and finally Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, where he was the Operations Officer (G-3) of the 2nd Marine Division. Bill he retired as a Colonel in 1976 after 25 years of commissioned service.

He earned a Masters of Arts in Economics from the University of Maryland, and a Masters of Business Administration from Auburn University. He was also a graduate of the Air War College and was a member of the Resident Faculty of the National War College.

Settling in San Diego in 1976 with Claire, "Hutch" as he was called by friends and family, began a second career at the Convair Division of General Dynamics where he managed the Operations Analysis group for the Tomahawk Cruise Missile. His group devised numerous missions and warheads for the Tomahawk that were subsequently used in combat

and remain incorporated in the system today. He continued to work for Convair and its successors until he was 70.

Hutch was a member of the San Diego Yacht Club for nearly 30 years. He initially owned a sailboat, but in his later years turned to power owning a 34-foot trawler named "Sea Duty". He was a dedicated Cruise Captain and enjoyed many cruises and activities with the SDYC Cruising Fleet.

Hutch was known for his dedication to duty and his fighting spirit. He was a regular at the gym well into his 80s. He was a gentleman, a well-read scholar, a moral man and possessed a wry sense of humor, a deep voice. His words were few but well-chosen. He was predeceased by Claire, his wife of 60 years, and by two sisters. He is survived by his wife Anne of San Diego; son Bill (Vanessa) Hutchison of Boise, Idaho; son Andy (Susan) Hutchison of Seattle, Washington; and grandsons John David Hutchison of Los Angeles and Brian Quinn Hutchison of Seattle and numerous nieces and a nephew.
