Travis Manion Foundation (TMF)

Following his graduation from the Naval Academy in 2004, 1st Lt. Travis Manion, USMC, was killed by a sniper on April 29, 2007 while saving his wounded teammates in Iraq.

Shortly after his death, the fallen Marine’s mother, the late Janet Manion, created the Travis Manion Foundation (TMF) to carry on the legacy of character, service and leadership embodied by all of our nation’s fallen heroes. Founded in Doylestown, PA, TMF has generated a national movement that is inspired by the words Travis spoke before leaving for his second and final deployment – “If Not Me, Then Who...”

Three years after Travis’ death, his best friend and Naval Academy roommate, LT (SEAL) Brendan Looney, USN, was killed in a helicopter crash in Afghanistan. Brendan’s widow, Amy Looney, inspired by her husband’s sacrifice, founded TMF’s second office in San Diego, CA in 2010. Since that time, the Travis Manion Foundation has established 4 national offices, served more than 60,000 veterans and survivors, and strengthened communities throughout the nation. Last Call – Obituaries

Local

CAPT William Henry Hamilton Jr. USN (ret), USNA ’49 passed away on Nov 23, 2016; aged 89. He was a native of San Diego, CA and was the son of the late Adm. William H. Hamilton, Sr. and Marjorie P. Hamilton. A top graduate of Greenbrier Military School and Bullis Preparatory, CAPT Hamilton served as a US Naval Aviator during the Korean War. Shortly afterwards, he entered the Underwater Demolition Teams (UDT) in California and eventually became Chief of UDT on the East Coast. CAPT Hamilton was then ordered to the Pentagon to organize a Special Ops group, which was ultimately designated Sea, Air, and Land Teams, making him the “Father of the SEALs”. He was recruited to work with the CIA for 6 years, and then he returned to complete his naval career. His book “Night Fighter” was recently released and covers his life from Korea to SEAL Team 6. CAPT Hamilton is survived by his wife Barbara; his children Jean, Bill, and Jan; 6 grandchildren; and 7 great-grandchildren. Services were held at Arlington National Cemetery. Online condolences may be offered to the family at hdliver.com.

CAPT James W. Organ, USN (ret.), USNA ’52, passed away peacefully with family at his bedside at his home in Coronado, on December 9, 2017 of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), aged 85. Jim was born January 27, 1931 in San Pedro, CA, and was the son of RADM and Mrs. William H. Organ USN (Ret) ’27. CAPT Organ graduated from the Naval Academy in 1952.

While at the Naval Academy, he played varsity tennis and squash. He was the Captain of the squash team and was named All-American in squash in 1952.

CAPT Organ graduated from submarine school in 1953 and subsequently served on diesel submarines. From 1965-67, he commanded USS Albacore (AGSS-569), a high-speed, unconventionally powered research submarine that introduced the teardrop hull form into Navy submarine design. Under his command, the Albacore set a world record for submarine submerged speed.

Before retiring from the Navy in 1979, CAPT Organ served as Chairman of Mechanical Engineering Division at the Naval Academy, Chief Staff Officer for Submarine Squadron Four in Charleston SC, Executive Assistant to the Assistant Secretary of the Navy for R&D, and Director, Electromagnetic and Acoustic Research, Naval Sea Systems Command. In addition to his Bachelor's Degree from USNA, he also earned a Master's degree in Engineering Administration from George Washington University in 1966. During his 27 years of service, CAPT Organ was recognized with the following awards and commendations: Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal, & the Navy Commendation Medal.

In 1979 he joined System Planning Corporation, Arlington VA, and retired fully in 1993 after 14 years in business. In retirement, among other activities, he provided tax assistance through the AARP Tax Aide program at the Coronado Public Library. He enjoyed trout fly-fishing and skiing. Tennis was his sport for a lifetime, golf a challenge for his later years. His enjoyment of life remained undiminished as his illness progressed due to the loyalty of his Naval Academy classmates and his golf and tennis friends that he met through the La Jolla Beach and Tennis Club.

His first marriage to Barbara Gordon Crabtree in 1969 in Annapolis, MD ended in divorce in 1983. He married Jeannette Abrom Baker in 1995 in Coronado, CA where he then resided. He is survived by his wife Jeannette of Coronado, son Christopher of Haleiwa, Hawaii, five stepchildren, three grandchildren, eight step-grandchildren, sister Perry Carroll of Santa Barbara CA, two nephews and a niece and brother Ted Orland (Francis) of Santa Cruz. A family mass, graveside service and celebration of Jim's life were held on Dec. 17th.
